Happy Easter



San Salvatore in Lauro, Rome, Italy

Nestled in Rome's historic Ponte district, San Salvatore in Lauro stands as a significant yet often overlooked witness to the living tradition of the Catholic Church. Built on the ruins of an ancient pagan temple, and rebuilt in its present form in the late 17th century, the church has been mentioned in documents since 1192. Its name, 'Holy Saviour in Lauro,' recalls both its dedication to Christ the Saviour and the laurel forest (*laurus* in Latin and *lauro* in popular language) that once flourished on the land.



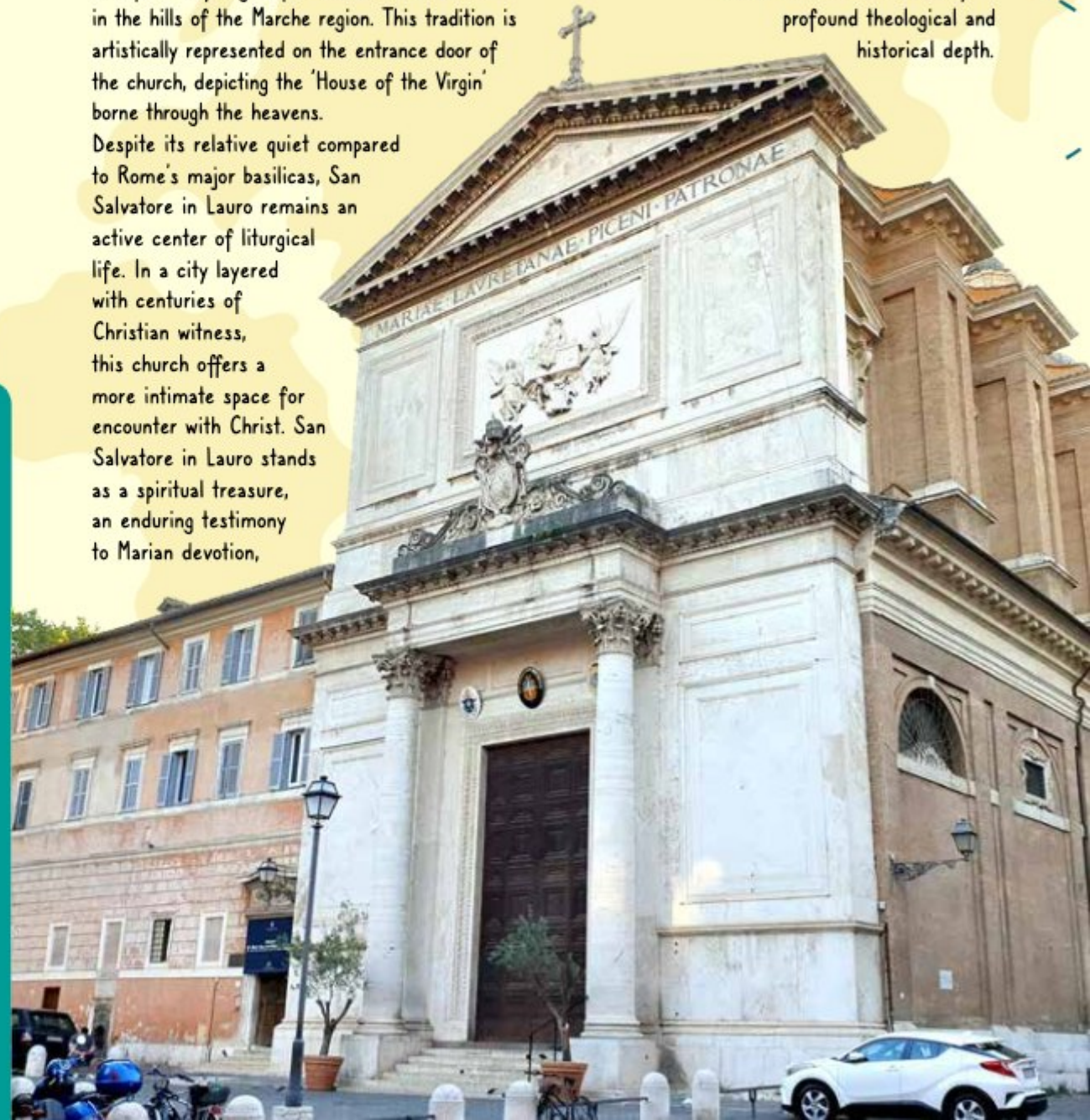
Today, it has become the church of the *Marchigiani* (people from the Italian region of Le Marche). Coincidentally, their patron is the Madonna of Loreto (*laureto*, from *laurus*)! This connection roots the church deeply in one of the most beloved Marian traditions of Italy.

San Salvatore in Lauro is not merely an architectural monument but a vibrant place of worship. It houses relics of St Padre Pio and St Jude Thaddeus, drawing devotees who seek their intercession.



The church is also closely linked to the devotion of the Madonna di Loreto, recalling the tradition of the Holy House of Nazareth. According to longstanding Catholic tradition, the house in which the Blessed Virgin Mary received the Annunciation was miraculously transported by angels from Nazareth to Loreto in the hills of the Marche region. This tradition is artistically represented on the entrance door of the church, depicting the 'House of the Virgin' borne through the heavens. Despite its relative quiet compared to Rome's major basilicas, San Salvatore in Lauro remains an active center of liturgical life. In a city layered with centuries of Christian witness, this church offers a more intimate space for encounter with Christ. San Salvatore in Lauro stands as a spiritual treasure, an enduring testimony to Marian devotion,

Eucharistic faith, and the universality of the Church. It is a reminder that within Rome's vast sacred landscape, even the lesser-known churches carry profound theological and historical depth.

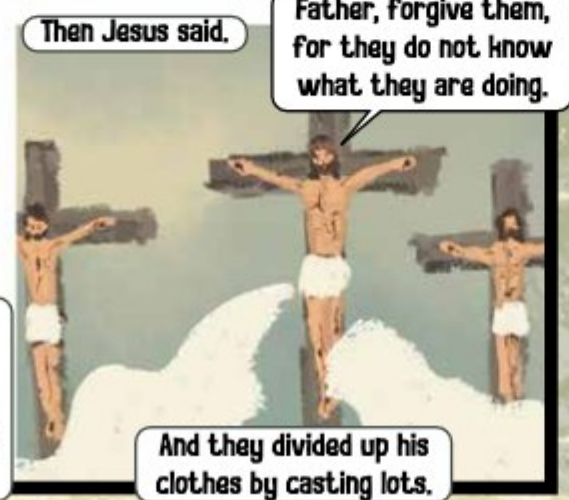
Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep for yourselves and for your children.

The soldiers also came up and mocked him. They offered him sour wine and said,

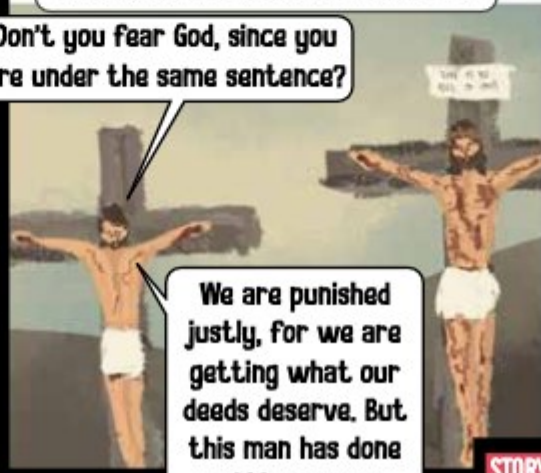
If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself.

Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.



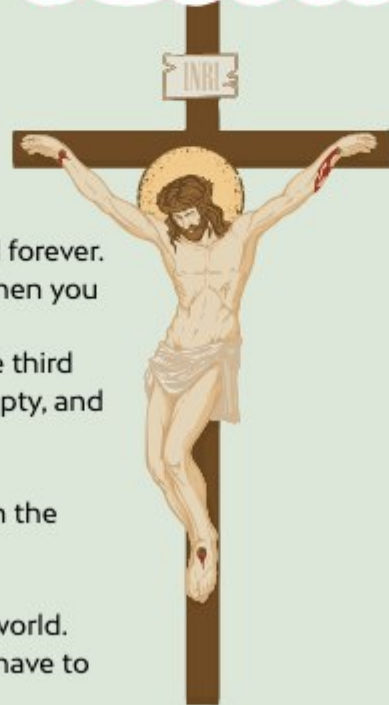

The Eucharist Explained

ELEMENTS OF THE MASS PART 4

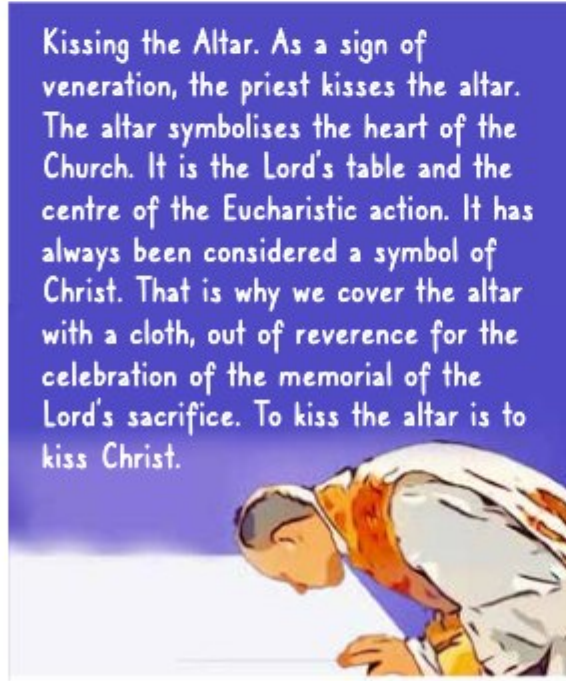
Hello buddies,

We will pick up from where we left off. Now, Vestments make us wonder - what's with all the colours? Nothing in Mass is without meaning. White or gold are about rejoicing and purity. They are used for the Feasts of Our Lord and for all saints who are not martyrs. Red has two meanings. One, it represents the shedding of blood, i.e., the Passion of the Lord and for Feasts of martyrs. The second thing it represents is fire, i.e. Masses of the Holy Spirit.

Green is used in Ordinary Time and focuses on the public ministry of the Lord. Violet or purple is used during



Advent and Lent as a sign of penance, sacrifice and preparation. It is also used for Christian burials and Masses for the dead. Rose indicates joy and is worn on Gaudete Sunday (the third Sunday of Advent) and Laetare Sunday (the fourth Sunday of Lent).



The Sign of the Cross. 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the

Holy Spirit. Amen.' We basically begin all prayers with the Sign of the Cross and is probably the first thing we learned, so used to it that it might be mechanical by now! Remember, while making this sign that this is God's signature of ownership upon you. This was the sign by which in Baptism we became part of God's family and a child of His. It also points to the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross and how we are saved. In making this sign, we invoke God's presence and invite Him to bless, assist, and guard us from all harm. It is a very simple yet powerful prayer. Can we keep all this in mind next time we make the sign, and not just rush through it...?

Soon after, we have the Greeting. The priest says, 'The Lord be with you,' or 'The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.' Instead of a 'Hi' or 'How are you' or 'It's good to see you,' we get the sense that something special, grand and sacred is taking place.

I know what's on your mind right now. Why do we say, 'And with your spirit?' It is from Latin: *Et cum spiritu tuo*. The priest's greeting, 'The Lord be with you,' is a Bible verse from Ruth 2:4; and we see the people's response, 'The Lord be

with your spirit,' in 2 Timothy 4:22. But what does spirit mean here?

LET US REMEMBER, when celebrating Holy Mass, the priest stands in the place of Christ, as Christ Himself. 'Here "spirit" refers not to the soul of the priest but to the spirit he has received through the sacrament of Holy Orders. We are acknowledging the Holy Spirit's unique activity through the priest during the sacred liturgy by virtue of his ordination. The people are saying in effect, "Be the priest for us now," aware that there is only one priest, Christ Himself, and that this one who represents them now must be finely tuned to perform his sacred duties well.' (*A Biblical Walk Through the Mass*, Edward Sri). The greeting at the start of Mass is a prayer that the Lord will be present with the people, and a prayer back from the people acknowledging the spiritual gift God has given to the priest to help lead us in prayer.

See how wonderful and meaningful each word in the Holy Mass is! Have you had time to think about all this while attending Mass? If not, let's start today. That's for now buddies. See ya next time!

We are not ready for you. You would do well to go back to Italy.



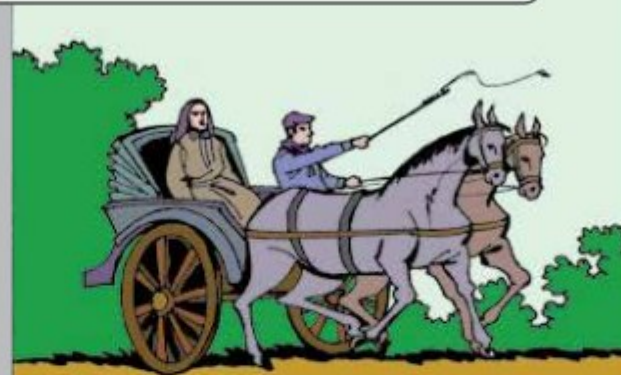
I have my orders from the Pope.

Despite this, they went on to establish schools, orphanages and hospitals for the needy. Soon, their work spread outside New York to the rest of America.

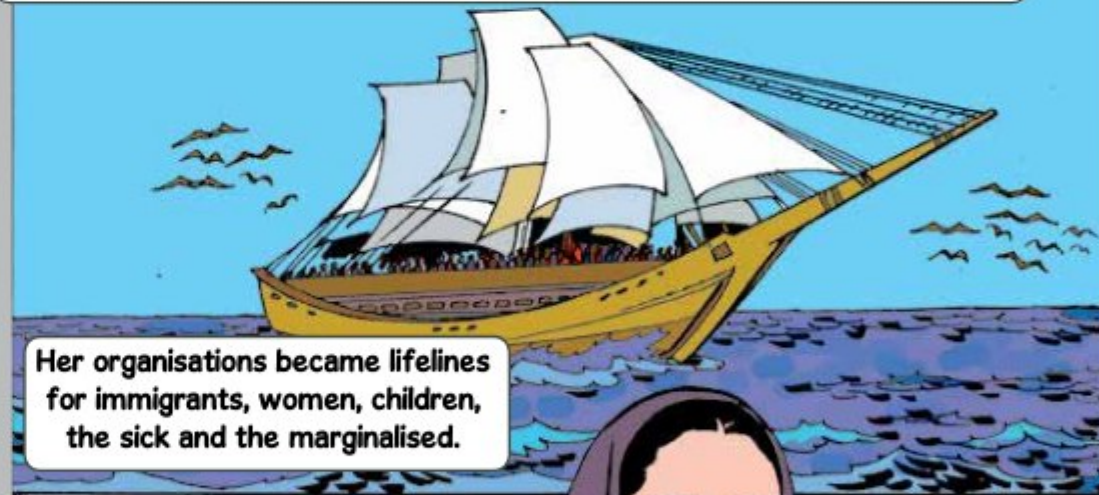


Their mission expanded even further as Mother Cabrini travelled to Nicaragua, Chile, Brazil, and Argentina. The journeys were not easy and the areas she visited were unsafe, but she trusted in God.

I travel, work, suffer my weak health, meet with a thousand difficulties, but all these are nothing, for this world is so small. I am accustomed to dwell in eternity.



Over the next twenty-seven years, Mother Cabrini sailed across the ocean twenty-three times. This was remarkable especially for a woman who had feared water from childhood. She had founded 67 institutions on three continents: schools, hospitals, orphanages, and missions.



Her organisations became lifelines for immigrants, women, children, the sick and the marginalised.

The greatest gift we can give to others is not material possessions, but the gift of ourselves. It is through our love and service that we can truly make a difference in the world.

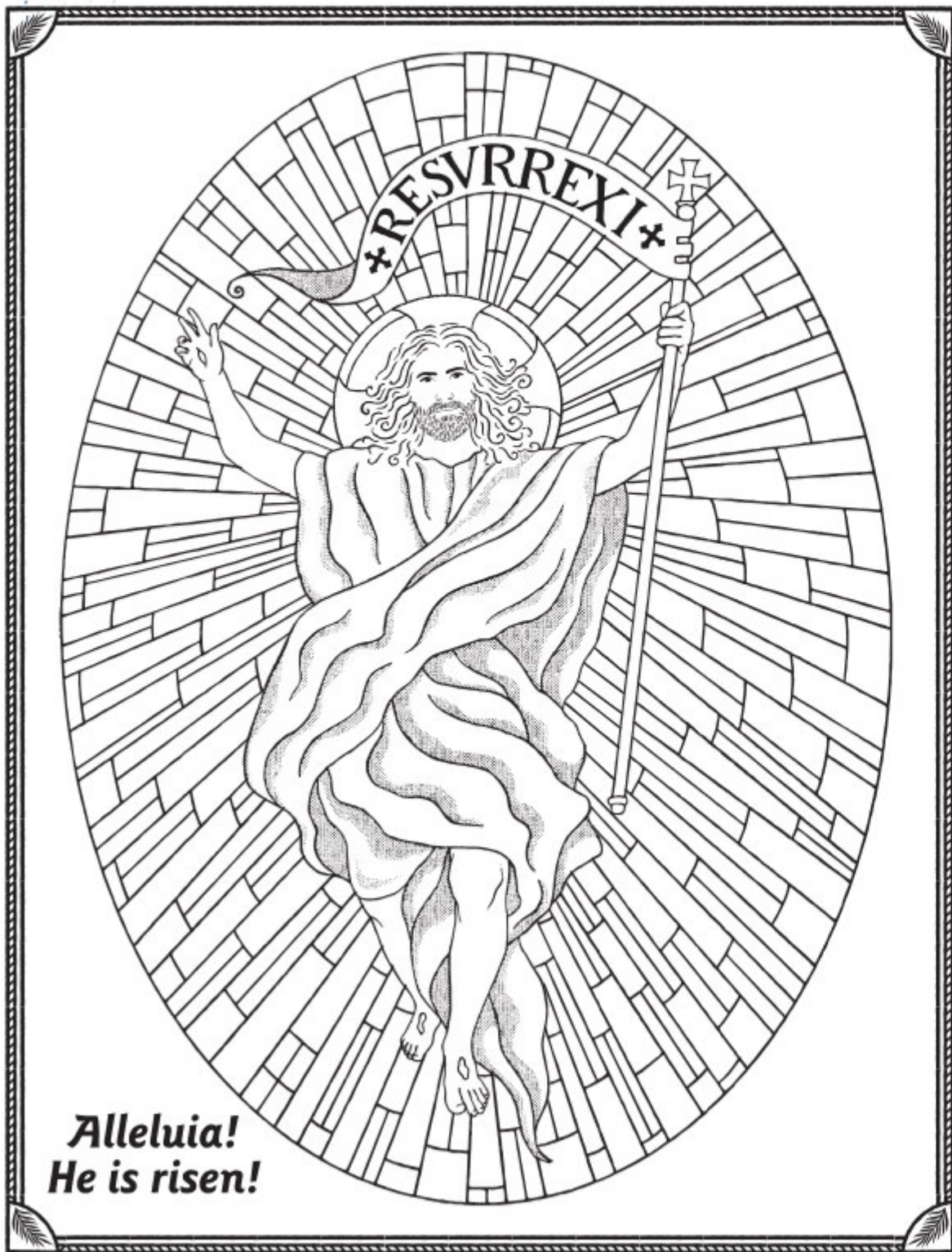

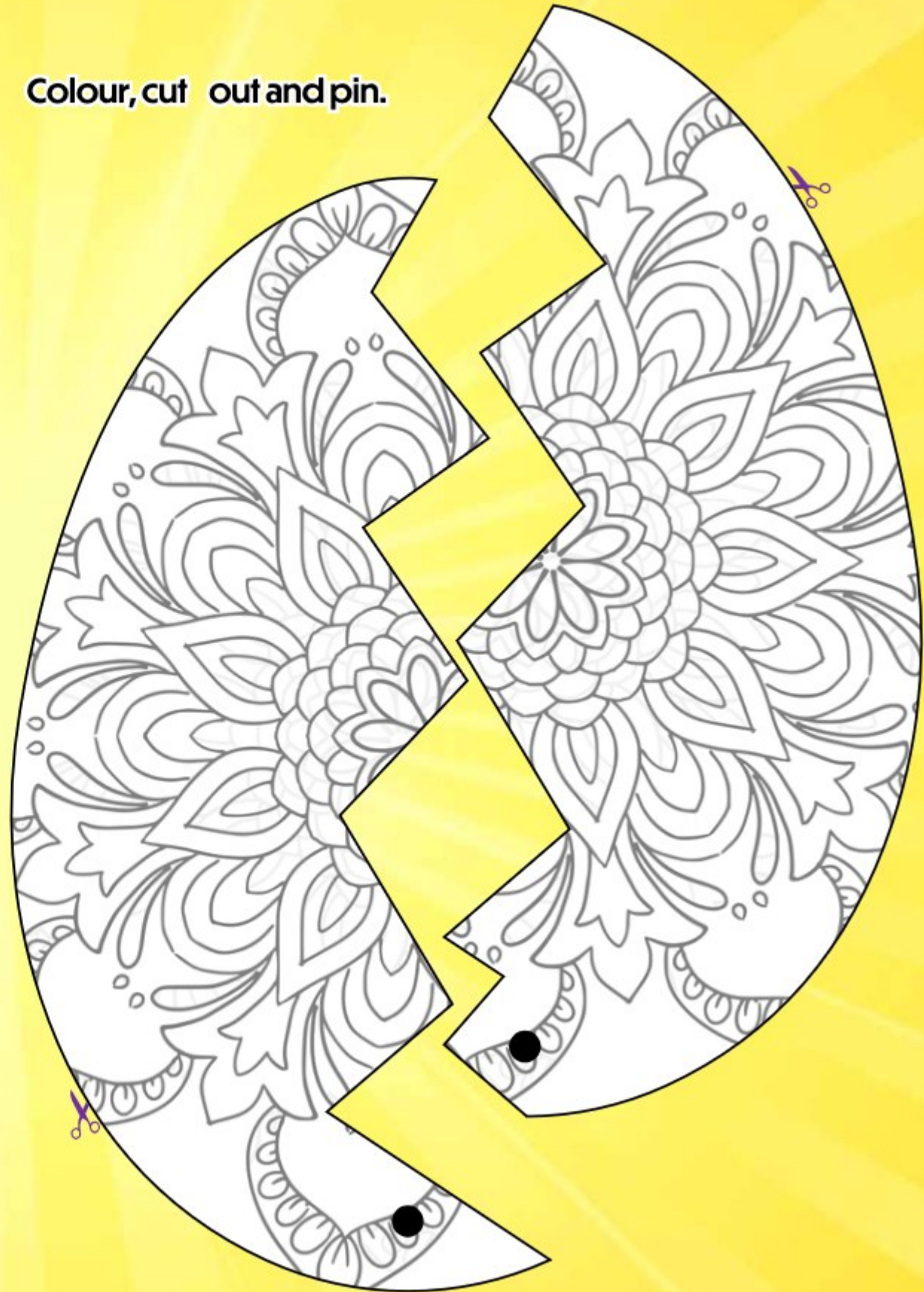
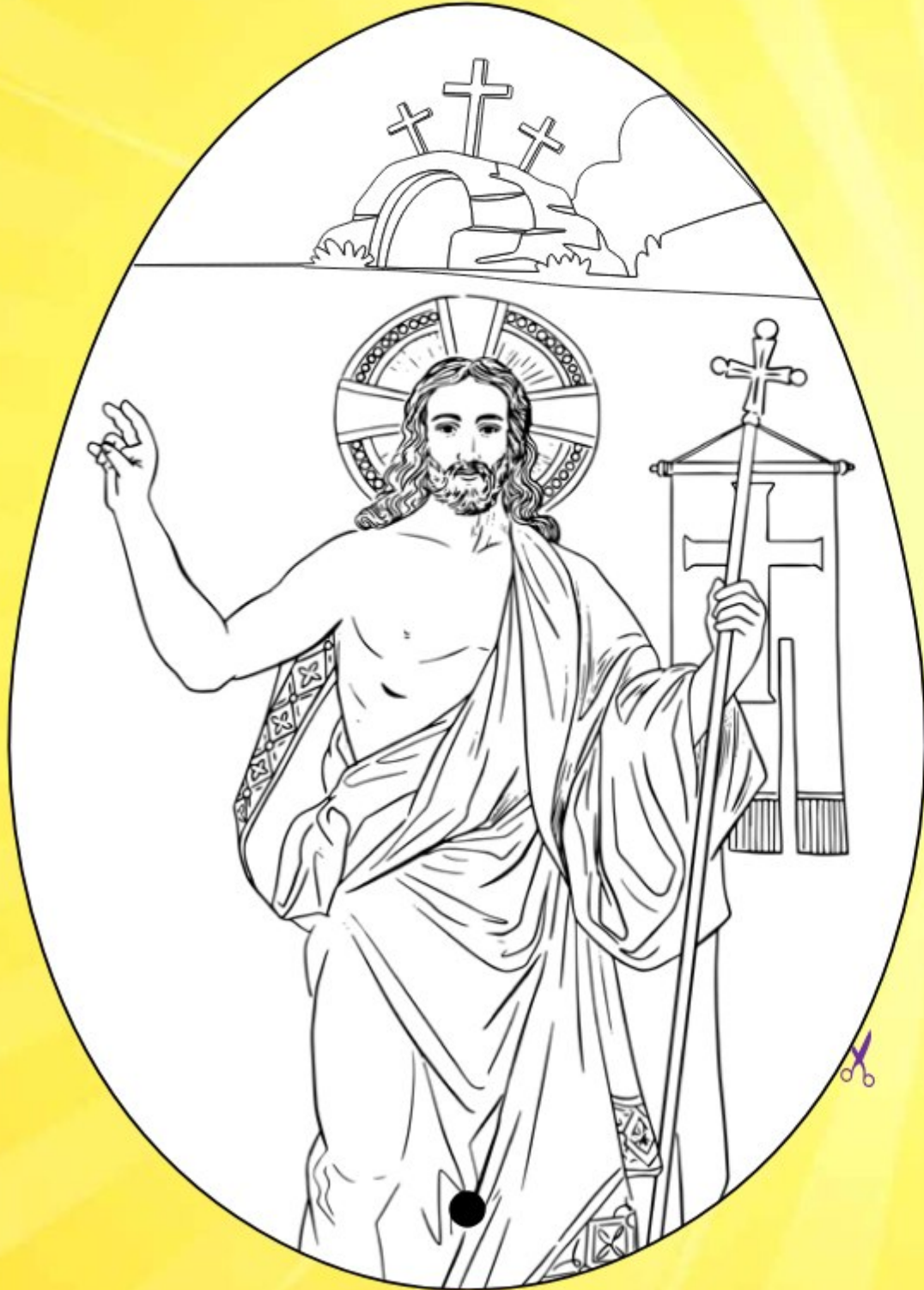

Corner Bookmark

MATERIALS REQUIRED

- Coloured paper
- Pencil
- Sticker or image cut-outs
- Scissors
- Glue
- White cardstock (optional)



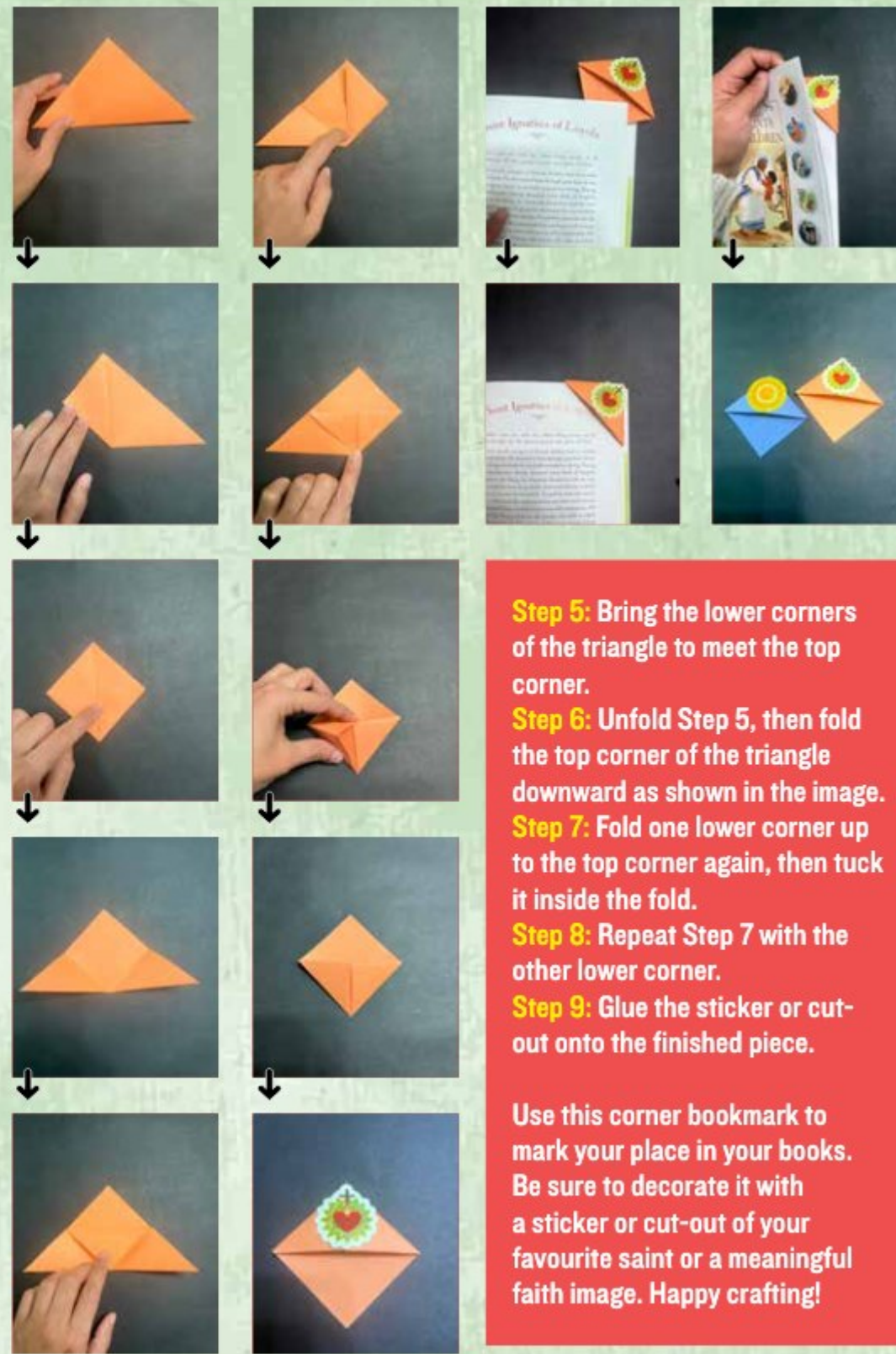
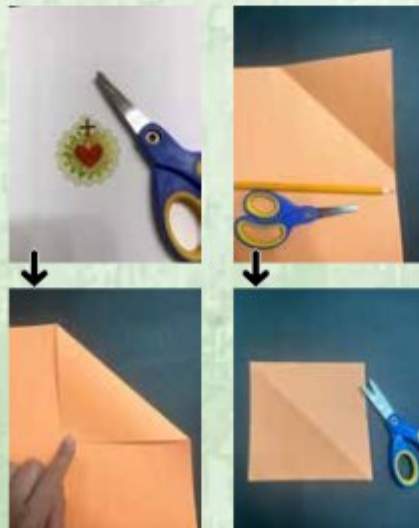
STEPS

Step 1: Attach the sticker or cut-out to a piece of cardstock and cut around its shape. (Skip this step if the cut-out is already thick enough.)

Step 2: Measure 5 inches from one corner of the coloured paper and fold it diagonally. Mark the edges to form a 5-inch square.

Step 3: Cut out the square.

Step 4: Fold the square diagonally to make a triangle.



Step 5: Bring the lower corners of the triangle to meet the top corner.

Step 6: Unfold Step 5, then fold the top corner of the triangle downward as shown in the image.

Step 7: Fold one lower corner up to the top corner again, then tuck it inside the fold.

Step 8: Repeat Step 7 with the other lower corner.

Step 9: Glue the sticker or cut-out onto the finished piece.

Use this corner bookmark to mark your place in your books. Be sure to decorate it with a sticker or cut-out of your favourite saint or a meaningful faith image. Happy crafting!

Science, Cells & A Mother's Love

Did you know science discovered something amazing about mothers and babies? When a baby grows inside a mother, they actually share cells with each other. Some of the baby's cells stay in the mother's body for the rest of her life, even in her heart! Scientists call this 'microchimerism'. It means the bond between a mother and child is deeper than we ever imagined.



Now think about Mary and Jesus. Jesus didn't just appear on earth, He grew inside Mary. He received His human body from her. She carried Him, nourished Him, and loved Him. Because of that, their connection wasn't just emotional, it was physical and real.

During the Holy Week, we remember that while Jesus was dying on the Cross, He looked at Mary and His disciple John and said:

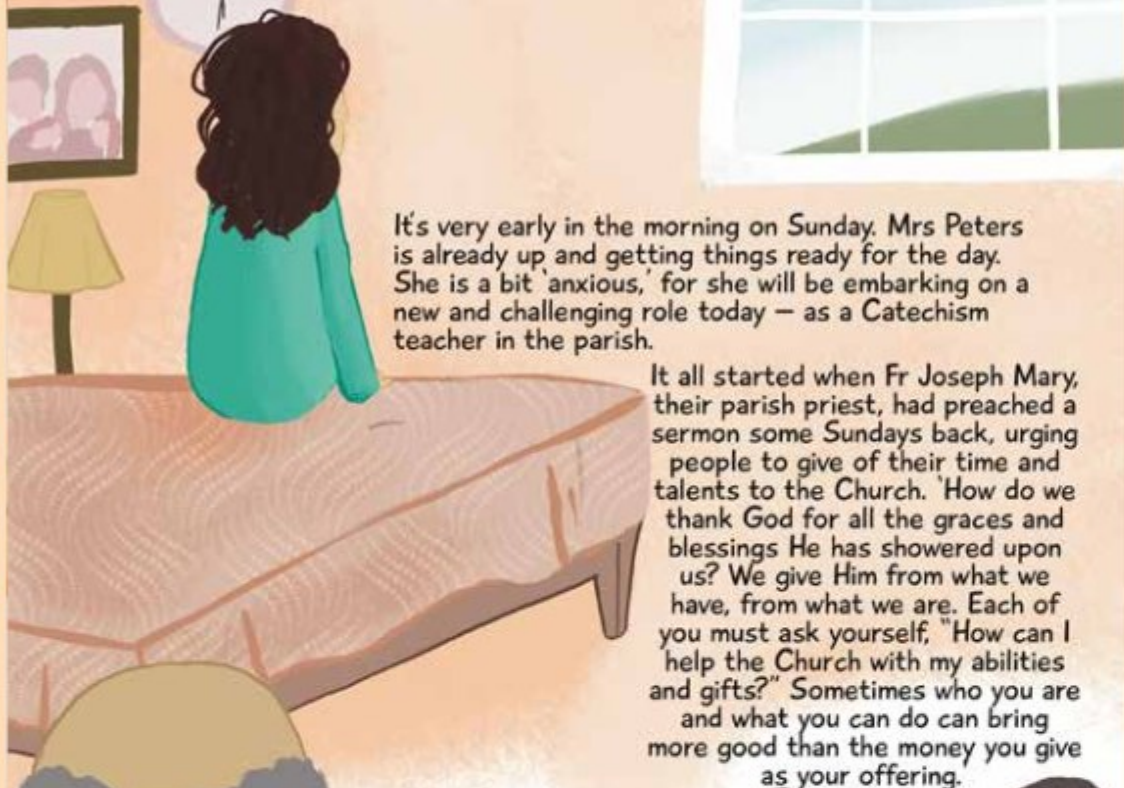
Behold your mother (John 19:27).

In that moment, Jesus gave Mary to all of us as our spiritual mother. As Catholics, we also believe something incredible about the Eucharist: when we receive Holy Communion, Jesus is truly present, not just a symbol, but really Him. So here's the beautiful mystery: the same Jesus who took His body from Mary gives that Body to us in the Eucharist. Through Him, we become part of God's family.

Science shows us that a mother and child stay connected at a cellular level. Faith shows us something even greater, that through Jesus, we are spiritually connected to Him and to Mary forever.

God didn't save us from far away. He came close. He became a baby. He had a mother. And He still gives himself to us today.

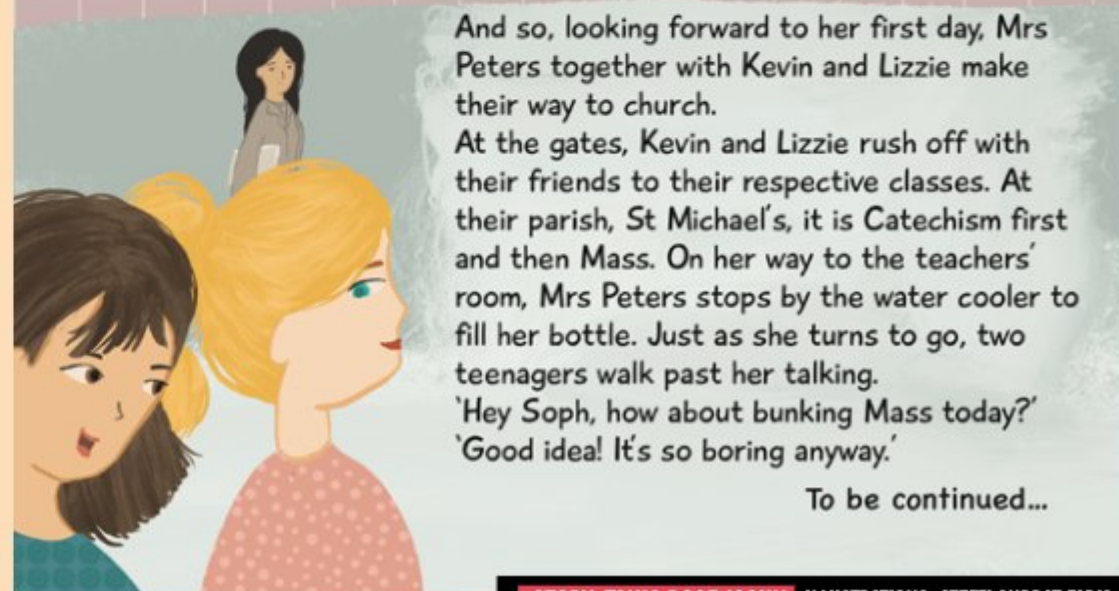
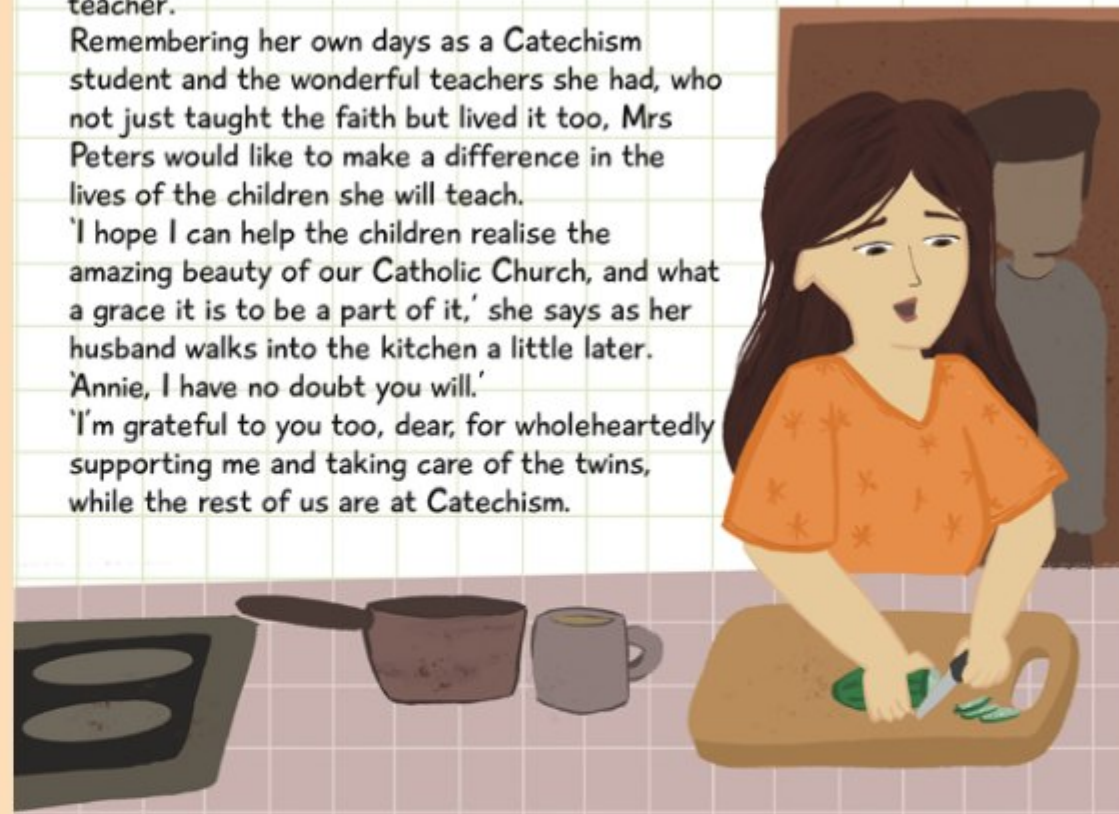
So, after thinking and praying about it, and talking it over with her husband, Mrs Peters decided she would give of her time and talent as a Catechism teacher.

'I'm grateful to you too, dear, for wholeheartedly supporting me and taking care of the twins, while the rest of us are at Catechism.'

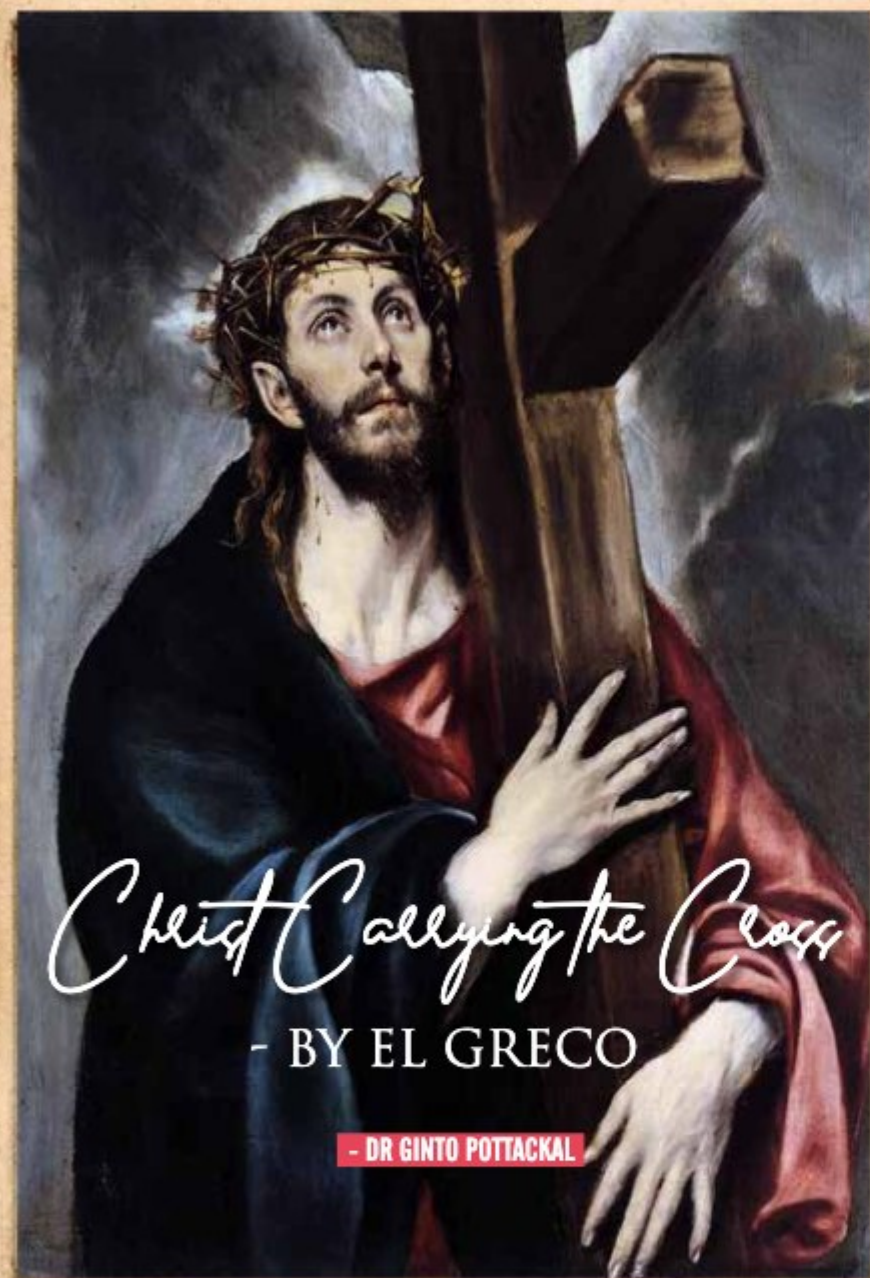


And so, looking forward to her first day, Mrs Peters together with Kevin and Lizzie make their way to church.

Christ Carrying the Cross

CHRIST CARRYING THE CROSS IS A FAMOUS PAINTING BY THE SPANISH MASTER ARTIST, EL GRECO. PAINTED IN 1580, THIS ARTWORK CAPTURES JESUS CHRIST'S PASSION WHILE CARRYING THE CROSS. THIS IS ONE OF EL GRECO'S MANY PAINTINGS ON THE SAME THEME.



This painting highlights the suffering of Jesus for the salvation of mankind. His hands are positioned to show Jesus willingly embracing the cross. His upward gaze to heaven suggests that He has received a confirmation for His Gethsemane prayer: *Father, if you are willing, take this cup*

away from me; still, not my will but yours be done. The Father has revealed His will and Jesus willingly accepts the cross from the Father.

The painting sets the scene against a backdrop of a wild, rising storm, suggesting that even nature offers Jesus no comfort in this moment. Yet Jesus remains calm, a posture that symbolises His serenity in the midst of tribulation and agony.

The mystical light falling from above evokes the divine presence, illuminating the scene with a sense of heavenly intervention.

El Greco was a Greek who became a master artist in Spain. His real name was Domenikos Theotokopoulos. He was born in Crete, Greece around 1541 likely to a Greek Orthodox family. In his 20s, he trained in the Byzantine art tradition, then he moved to Venice around 1567 to study under master artists of the time, Titian and Tintoretto.

El Greco likely converted to Catholicism upon arriving in Europe. He described himself as a 'devout Catholic' in his will and immersed himself in Counter-Reformation spirituality in Spain. In Toledo, he painted altarpieces like *The Assumption of the Virgin* for Santo Domingo el Antiguo and portraits of nobles and clergy, running

a workshop with his son Jorge Manuel. He died there in 1614.

El Greco used Mannerist style in his paintings. It is a 16th-century art style which distorted natural forms with elongated figures and unnatural colours. Following this tradition, El Greco created dramatic scenes with twisting poses and mystical lighting. He prioritised communicating divine messages over achieving mere realism.

Baptism

Koine Greek: βάπτισμα (βάπτισμα)
Meaning: Immersion, or 'dipping in water.'

Baptism is the very first of the seven sacraments and is often called the 'door' to the Church. It is the sacrament of new life, where we are washed clean of Original Sin and become an adopted son or daughter of God and a member of the Body of Christ.



Personal Application :

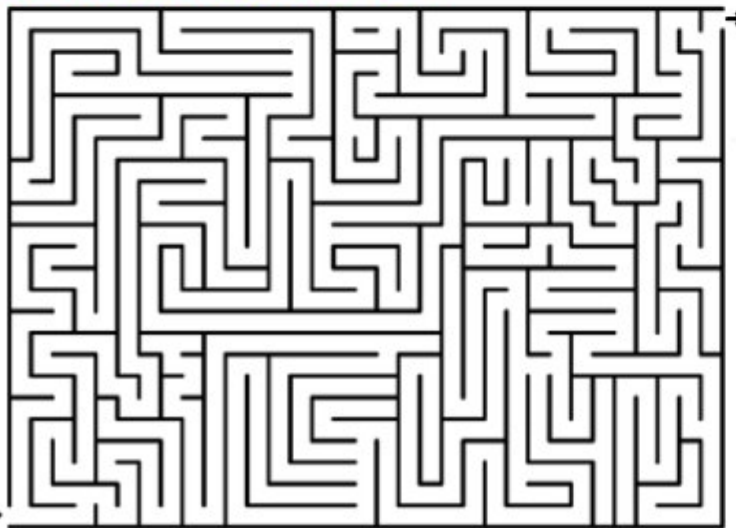
At your Baptism, you were 'claimed for Christ' by making the Sign of the Cross on your forehead. Every time you make the Sign of the Cross on yourself, remember that you are God's beloved child, and you belong to His team!

Interesting Fact:

The large bowl of holy water where most baptisms take place is sometimes lovingly called 'The Jordan' in church books, after the Jordan River where Jesus Himself was baptised.

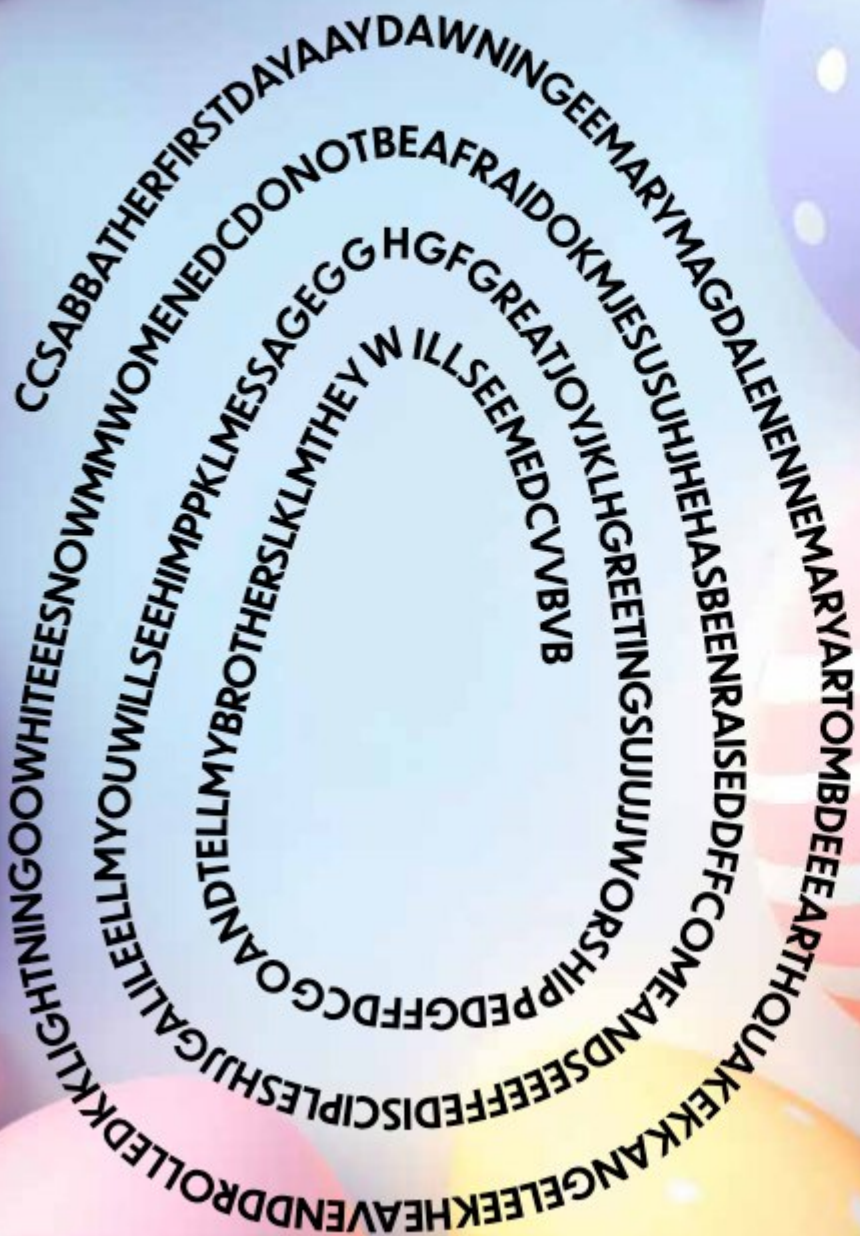

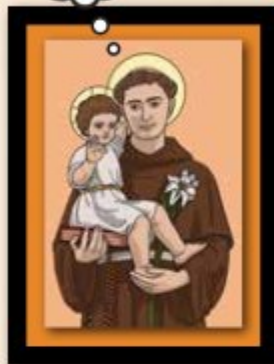
