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
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EDITORIAL

So this season, remember:


● A kind word is a Christmas gift.

The Sant'Andrea Quirinale is a Roman Catholic church located on Quirinal Hill in Rome. A place of formation and prayer built by the Jesuits to replace a previous church, it became a living catechism of Christian spirituality. The church was named after St Andrew the apostle, brother of St Peter and the first to be called by Christ. They say that St Andrew was a soul willing to go wherever Jesus Christ went. The feast day of the Sant'Andrea Quirinale is November 30th. We celebrate the Sant'Andrea Quirinale because it's a strong, solid symbol of the Catholic counter-reformation.

The building was designed by artist Gian Lorenzo Bernini. He was an architect, sculptor, and painter. The church possesses a rare oval plan. The entrance is deliberately narrow symbolising the 'narrow gate' that leads to life (Matthew 7:14). The main altar tells the story of St Andrew's martyrdom. The painting beneath depicts the saint on his X-shaped cross, his face serene with faith, while above a sculpture shows his soul rising heavenward. Between these two levels – suffering and glory – lies the Christian mystery of the cross: through death comes life, through surrender comes victory. Bernini used a hidden window high up on the ceiling above the altar




to let in natural light representing the heavenly realm. The construction began in 1658 and finished around 1670. On the sloping incline of the Quirinale hill in Rome, this is one of the most spiritually moving masterpieces of Baroque architecture. At the very top of the gilded dome, a dove representing the Holy Spirit is encircled by putti, symbolising divine grace and inspiration descending from heaven.



The interior contains chapels dedicated to other saints, such as St Francis Xavier and St Ignatius of Loyola. In the chapel of St Stanislaus Kostka, a young Polish Jesuit novice who died in 1568, his incorrupt body rests beneath the altar and many visitors pause here to entrust their children, their vocations and their faith journey to his intercession.

Sant'Andrea al Quirinale, Rome teaches without words that the ultimate pilgrimage leads not to a place but to a person – Christ Himself.

He is worthy of death.


Then they spit in his face and struck him with their fists. Others slapped him and said,

The Miracle Inside Your Brain When You Pray

Have you ever wondered what happens inside you when you pray? When we start to pray, something very special happens, not just in our hearts, but also in our brains! When you decide to pray, your *thinking brain* (the part that helps you make choices) wakes up and says, 'Let's talk to God!' That's the first step. You are choosing to spend time with God, just like you choose to talk to a good friend.

Then, another part of your brain, called the *feeling brain*, joins in. This part helps you feel love, peace, and kindness. When we pray or say the Rosary, this 'feeling brain' sends calm messages through your body. Your heart slows down, your breathing becomes softer, and your body feels warm and relaxed. It's like your whole body is giving you a gentle hug!



When you pray every day, especially when you say the Rosary, your brain becomes stronger at feeling thankful and hopeful.

Inside your brain, certain messengers, called dopamine and serotonin, help your body feel calm and your heart happy. These happy messengers help you feel peaceful and joyful when you pray. Scientists have even taken special pictures of people's brains while they meditate or pray, and they observed the parts of the brain that make people feel calm light up, just like tiny stars! When you pray every day, especially when you say the Rosary, your brain becomes stronger at feeling thankful and hopeful. It's like watering

a garden of peace inside your head! The more you pray, the more your brain learns to stay calm, even when things go wrong.

And do you know what else?

When your brain and heart are calm, your whole body becomes healthier. Your heart works better, you sleep better, and you feel happier. God made our brains this way on purpose, so that talking to Him would bring us peace and love. So next time you hold your rosary, remember: every 'Hail Mary' is not just a prayer, it's also a gift to your mind, your heart, and your body.

Prayer makes you radiant with calm, joy, and love, just the way God wants you to.

ST CATHERINE LABOURE

Part 2

On July 19th 1830, Catherine was woken from her sleep by a child's voice calling her to the chapel, as the Blessed Virgin Mary was awaiting her. As Catherine approached the chapel, the door opened and a brilliant light shone.

God wishes to charge you with a mission. You will be contradicted, but do not fear; you will have the grace to do what is necessary. Tell your spiritual director all that passes within you. Times are evil in France and in the world. Come to the foot of the altar. There, graces will be shed upon all, great and little, especially on those who ask for them.

In 1830, Catherine joined the Daughters of Charity. Briefly after this happened, God was pleased to grant her many extraordinary visions. On three consecutive days she beheld the heart of Saint Vincent above the reliquary in which his relics were exposed, each time under a different colour. At other times, she beheld the Lord in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

In November 1830, the Blessed Mother visited Catherine again during evening prayer. She showed herself inside an oval frame, standing upon a globe with rays of light coming from her hands toward the globe. Around the frame were the words, 'O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee.'

All who wear them will receive great graces.



Mother Mary asked Catherine to take these images to her confessor, Father Jean Marie Aladel so they could be placed on medallions. At first, the priest did not believe Catherine. However, after two years, he brought her story to the archbishop. The archbishop ordered 2,000 medals to be made. The medals were distributed so rapidly and effectively it was said to be miraculous.

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





Advent Wreath

- ROSE MARY TOM

MATERIALS

- 1 paper plate (for the wreath base)
- 1 Purple and 1 pink colour A4 size paper or 4 toilet paper rolls (for the candles)
- Paints or coloured paper: purple & pink (for candles), green (for leaves)
- Yellow & orange paper or paint (for flames)
- Glue or double-sided tape
- Scissors
- Pencil or pen
- Optional: glitter, ribbon, markers, or stickers for decoration

STEPS

Step 1: Prepare the Base



Cut out the center of the paper plate, leaving the outer ring (like a donut shape).

Paint or cover the ring with green paper to look like evergreen leaves.

You can also cut small leaf shapes from green paper and glue them around the ring for a textured look.

Step 2: Make the Candles

Fold and cut the A4 size paper to 4 equal pieces, roll each piece into a cylindrical shape and fix it with glue or tape. Alternatively, take 4 toilet paper rolls. Paint or wrap 3 in purple paper and 1 in pink paper.



Step 3: Attach the Candles
Glue or tape the 4 rolls upright onto the wreath base (spaced evenly around the circle).

You can glue them directly onto the paper plate or on small paper 'stands' for extra support.

Step 4: Create the Flames

Cut small flame shapes from yellow and orange paper. Optionally, glue them to toothpicks or small rolled paper stems so they can be inserted each week.

Each Sunday of Advent, you can 'light' a candle by adding its paper flame.

Step 5: Decorate the Wreath

Add small paper berries (red dots), bows, or stickers.

These represent the 4 Advent candles:
Purple - Hope, Faith, and Peace
Pink - Joy

Note: You may add a white paper roll candle in the center of the wreath for Christ's candle. (on Christmas Day).




Someone to Talk to


As he walked back home one evening after football practise, he passed a church and slowed down. Looking across the lawn, it felt as though someone was calling him inside.

O my help, hasten to aid me.'




'Hello son,' said a voice from behind. Turning, Joe saw an old priest behind him.

THE CHRONICLES OF NARNIA



Most of us have heard of, if not read, *The Chronicles of Narnia*, one of the greatest children's fantasy novels of all time, written by the well-known author, speaker, and professor, CS Lewis. For the few who have not, *The Chronicles* are composed of seven books, detailing the creation, rise, and fall of Narnia, a magical world similar yet different to ours. Enchanted by Lewis' enticing writing style, and humorous conversations, millions of children and adults alike have been transported to the land of talking animals, witches, and Puddleglums, all finding a home in the wondrous stories.

Narnia holds such original ideas and concepts, that one would wonder where CS Lewis drew his inspiration from for the diverse characters within the books. During the Second World War, CS Lewis opened his large, Oxford country home to many refugee children, fleeing from cities. As the story goes, the children loved to explore the large house and its rambling grounds, and one especially imaginative girl asked Lewis a question that would seal his reputation as an author forever; a simple question that went along the lines of, 'Can I go inside [a wardrobe] and see if there's anything behind it?' This question sparked something in Lewis, as he remembered the days of his own

childhood when he and his brother would play in imaginary worlds, known only to them. And very soon he sat down to create Narnia, unknowingly shaping a masterpiece with which children would be transported from this world into another.

Narnia itself has a long and troubled history.



But, most interestingly are the parallels with our world and the Bible. In fact, there are so many, one must assume Lewis could not have thought them all up, and proof that the Holy Spirit was truly working through him. Book one, *The Magician's Nephew* explores the creation of Narnia, and the entrance of evil into it, at the hands of the White Witch, who, in following years, takes over the land in a dictatorship, causing it to be 'Always winter, and never Christmas.' This eternal cold is broken by the four Pevensie siblings, as they reclaim the thrones held forever by the sons of Adam and daughters of Eve, as is described in *The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe*. *The Horse and His Boy*, *Prince Caspian*, and *The Silver Chair* follow the paths of children in Narnia, defeating evil time and time again. *The Last Battle* brings the endless push-and-pull to an end, with the ending of the world. From the creation of man (or animals) to the fall at the hands of the anti-Christ (or ape), to life eternal in heaven, Narnia bears all the troubles of the real world, though in a different sense.

A recurring figure in all of the books is Aslan, and well, I don't know where to start describing him. He is the Son of the Emperor-Over-The-Sea, the creator of Narnia, King above all kings, a massive lion, and many will say a representation of Jesus Christ. Through

the books Aslan proves himself sinless, and forgiving time and time again, though also fierce and protective. To quote one of His subjects: 'He's wild you know. Not like a tame lion.' Aslan is the sort of character each reader has his or her own special relationship with, and each person has their own interpretation of his actions.

It being the wondrous Christmas season right now, I thought it may be interesting to dive into the winter months in Narnia. As previously mentioned, while the White Witch ruled Narnia, it was constantly winter with snow and ice covering everything, and, due to the Witch's power, Father Christmas was forced to stay away from Narnia to the distraught of the Narnians. Over the course of *The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe* this eternal winter is broken, and Christmas comes once again, yet this seemingly insignificant plot detail may have more to it. Without Christmas winter is harsh, cold, and unforgiving. Yes, beauty can be found in the ice, but it is a cruel beauty, which is only warmed by the assurance that spring will come. Yet Christmas, set in the middle of winter, gives one hope; hope that the world will become green again, hope that a Saviour is born for us, hope that we will be saved, and the Narnia series perfectly captures this aspect.

So, if you've never read *The Chronicles of Narnia*, I heartily encourage you to allow yourself to be transported, through CS Lewis' writing to a wonderful and magical world. And, if you have already discovered Narnia, maybe take another look, for with every new read, something different is revealed.




